3. What does the Bible say about responding to a person like this? Does Proverbs 26:4 give the answer or does 26:5 give the answer?
4. Why do you think Paul's response is so forceful in the opening of verse 36?
5. Can you think of, or quickly find, some Bible references about how a fool thinks or places where someone was called a fool?
6. What makes these people, whom Paul is addressing, fools?
7. Are these people raising a valid point in verse 35? Is Paul too harsh?
8. Have you ever seen and heard (or have done it yourself) someone create an answer for a Bible topic they clearly didn't understand?
9. Do we sometimes need to hear words and tones like Paul is using here? Why?
10. Is it wrong to not have a full understanding to every Bible doctrine?
11. What should you do when you are struggling with coming to an understanding? Do you have any such struggles now?
