- 3. Why do we feel a pain inside when we experience such an injustice?
- 4. Why do you think John includes the detail of Mary remaining seated while Martha responds to meet Jesus while he is still outside the village?
- 5. Consider verse 22 and paraphrase it. What does Martha mean? Is there any indication that Jesus is upset by her statement?
- 6. Why do you think Martha speaks to Mary in private?
- 7. What is different about Mary's attitude and statement to Jesus that agitates his spirit?
- 8. Get behind the statements of verses 36 and 37. What is the attitude of these people and why does it deeply moves Jesus in his spirit?
- 9. What is Jesus responses to these things that *deeply* and *greatly* move his spirit?
- 10. What can we learn about how respond to people who are in grief or who assign incorrect motives, etc. even when they intend evil by it?
