4. Sarai broke no laws with her actions in verses Genesis 16:1-2. However, what mistake did she make? How do we make the same mistake in our lives?
5. What mistakes did Abram make in verses Genesis 16:1-6? Why do you think he listened to Sarai?
6. Sarai and Abram agreed to the same plan, why did their relationship suffer from this decision (See Genesis 16:4-6)? How can we fall into the same trap as them?
7. Peter states to be of sober mind and warns of a roaring lion in 1 Peter 5:6-11. How can you apply this verse to the issues facing Abram and Sarai? What happens when people who are desperate take advice from others who are in the same boat?
8. Comparing Abram and Sarai's decision in Genesis 16 to Adam and Eve's decision in Genesis 3, what similarities do you see? How is our thinking flawed if we blame only Sarai and Eve? What failures do we see in Adam and Abram?
